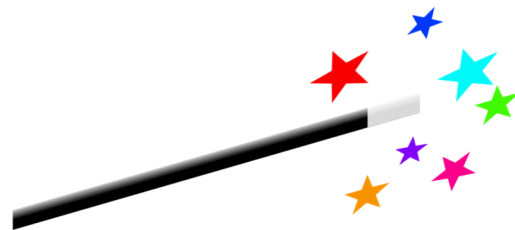
Improvements this year as perceived by parents
