
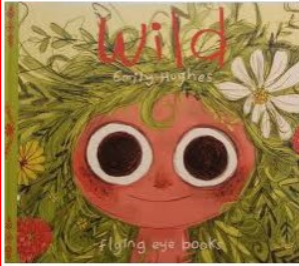


Year 2- Habitats

Useful Vocabulary

Habitat	A habitat is a home environment for plants and animals.
Micro-habitat	A micro-habitat is a very specific, small home environment (like a tree or pond).
Living	Things which can grow, move, breathe and reproduce.
Non-Living	Something that has never been alive.
Plants	A living thing that grows in the ground, usually has leaves or flowers and needs sun and water to survive.
Animals	Animals can be grouped into mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and amphibians.
Species	A group of animals, plants or other living thing that share common characteristics.

Producer	Plants are called producers because they produce their own food. They are the first part of a food chain.
